

Lewis Alexander Managing Director US Chief Economist

Lewis Alexander, Managing Director, is the US Chief Economist at Nomura, the global investment bank. He has a broad base of experience in senior policy making roles as well as past experience in the financial services industry.

Mr. Alexander joined Nomura in September 2011. From March 2009 through March 2011, he served as a Counselor to Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner, working on a wide range of domestic financial issues. These included the Supervisory Capital Assessment Program (bank stress tests), the cost and effectiveness of the Troubled Asset Relief Program (TARP) and analysis and monitoring of systemic risk. He also led the initial effort to establish the US Treasury's new Office of Financial Research. From 1999 through 2009, Mr. Alexander worked for Citigroup, first as the head of emerging market economics, and later as Citigroup's Chief Economist. Before joining Citigroup, he worked for ten years in the Division of International Finance of the Federal Reserve Board, lastly as Deputy Director. From 1993 through 1996, he also served as Chief Economist of the US Department of Commerce.

Mr. Alexander has an A.B. and A.M. from Stanford University and an M.Phil and Ph.D. from Yale University all in economics.
